FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS
Farmington Hills firefighters made 103 runs for the week of Jan. 20-26 including 70 medical runs and rescues (68 percent) and two fires.

FIRE
Firefighters from Station 4 put out an engine fire in a 1990 Ford Escort at the off ramp from I-696 at Orchard Lake at 1:55 p.m. Jan. 24. The fire caused \$2,500 in damage. The owner said the car had been serviced in Bowling Green, Ohio before he drove it to Michigan.

Firefighters from Station 1 responded to a tractor fire at the Independence Green Apartments on Washington Court at 2:23 p.m. Jan. 25. The 1965 Ford

tractor was being used to plow snow when the engine compartment caught fire. Apartment maintenance personnel put out the fire with a dry chemical extinguisher.

THEFT
In Farmington Hills:

BREAK-INS
In Farmington Hills:
The driver's door lock was

The driver, who was unhurt, told police she had fallen asleep. Tire tracks revealed the vehicle deflected off a guard rail, crossed both lanes of the highway and swerved back across M-6 before going off the road and into a bunch of small trees. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .15 percent.

Police arrested a Hills man, 22, for shaking and then dropping a 5-week old baby girl between Jan. 20-23. The man brought the child to the emergency room of Botsford General Hospital, claiming she had fallen. Police interviewed the man, who told them he shook and dropped her.

Police arrested a Hills man, 41, for beating his girlfriend, 31, at their residence south of Lytle and east of Drake at 8:16 p.m. Jan. 27. The man had been holding the woman down and choking her. She was screaming "help me!" when officers arrived and had to kick open the door.

ASSAULT
In Farmington Hills:
Police arrested a Melvindale man, 23, at the Cadillac Cafe on Grand River at 12:05 a.m. Jan. 27 for assault and battery of a Warren man, 22, who is the bouncer. The bouncer had asked the man to leave after being disruptive and the two argued and then shoved each other. The man got on top of the bouncer and began punching him in the nose and rib cage. He was not seriously injured.

VANDALISM

A Farmington Hills man, 20, was taken to Providence Hospital after calling Farmington police from a pay phone at Farmer Jack in the Crossroads Center Jan. 27, saying he wanted to die and asking police to shoot him. The man told the police he had enough medication and wouldn't feel it.

ABDUCTION ATTEMPT
In Farmington Hills:
A Farmington Hills girl, 15, told police that a man attempted to give her a ride home from the Grapevine Party Store on 12 Mile at 3:30 p.m. Jan. 21. The girl, who is a student at Harrison High School, said the man was sitting in a blue car, possibly a Chevy Nova or Plymouth Shadow, in the lot of the party store, saw her and told her to "come here." He offered her money and a ride home, but she refused and went into the store. He also went in, but left. She then went back to the school. The man is described as African-American, 6 feet tall, medium build, 30, and was wearing a full-length yellow and orange fur coat. His upper teeth were pointing inward.
