

POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FIRES

In Farmington Hills:

Firefighters from Stations 2 and 4 responded to a reported fire at a house on Sudbury at 1:59 p.m. March 15. A downed wire had crossed with a TV/cable wire and drawn current into the house, causing a large amount of smoke in the basement.

THEFT

In Farmington Hills:

Several pieces of jewelry were stolen from a residence on Citation between March 9-13. They included a \$600 Art Carved gold 1984 high school ring with a ruby stone with the letter "G" engraved with "Carl D.
