RANDY MORGAN (240 pounds): A senior who wrestled two years at Walled Lake Central, Morgan's record this season was 48-9. He was fifth at the was 48-9. Kretschmer placed fifth at state
the past three years to earn Allstate 'Besignation each year.
According to coach Sam Amine,
Kretschmer is the first Troy
wrestler to place at state in

three consecutive seasons. If it wasn't for a controversial slam called against Kretschmer at the state meet, Amine believes he would have placed higher than fifth this year. "He was the state's number one-ranked wrestler in Division I this year and it was kind of hard what happened to him (at the state meet)," said Amine. "It was unfortunate. In my eyes he was a state champion. One call kind of ruined his season." Kretschmer finished with a school record for most career victories. He was 46-4 this year, and won overy tournament he entered oxcept for the state meet.

■ SHL WALLACE (160 pounds):
A junior in his second year of varsity competition, Wallace won 30 of his 43 matches this winter for head coach Ray Went. Wallace placed third at the district, fourth at the regional and took eighth at the Division II state tournament. He was second in the annual Oakland County tournament but did not wrestle in the Oakland Activities Association meet because of an injury.

■ DEREK VOS (171 pounds): Vos, a senior captain and a four-year varsity voteran at Walled Lake Central, is a two-time All-Stater. He placed third at this year's Division I state meet after winning regional and district championships. Vos was 42-4 this year and finished his career with a 132-27 record. He also captured the Oakland County and Western Lakes Activities

Association (WLAA) titles. "He was right up there among the top wrestlers in the state. He just got beat by a point or he would have been in the finals (at state)," said Central coach Carl McBride.

\*\*RICHARD KUZMA (189 pounds): Kuzma, a senior, had an outstanding sensor for Rechester coach Glen Gagnon. The three-year varsity letter winner won every tournament he participated in this year up until the state meet. At the Division I state individual tournament, he lost to Roseville's Kyle Williamson in the championship match and placed second overall. Kuzma was 43-4 this season. "He has the flexibility and agility of a small man, yet is still very-strong and very fast. He has all the tools and he's one of the best wrestlers ever to come out of Rochestor, said Gagnon.

\*\*KIRT RUSHLOW (215 pounds): Rushlow made his mark as one of the best wrestlers in Avondale history. The Yellow Jacket senior was a three-year All-Stater, finishing fifth in 1995 (at heavyweight) and second this winter (at 215 pounds) in the individual state meet. Rushlow finished with a 148-23 career record and set the Avondale career pins record with 91 (the old mark was 78). He is a three-time Cakland County champion, and three-time Eccentric tournament champion. Rushlow finished this season with a 36-3

record, including two losses to eventual state champion Joe Fuller of Mt. Pleasant. He was first at the district tournament and second at the regional. Rushlew hopes to continue his wrestling career at the collegiate level this fall.

ADAM AININS (heavyweight): Adkins is a four-year variety veteran and a two-time All-Stater, Adkins owns a 138-33 career record and is number two at Troy in career victories. He finished with a 44-2 overall record this year and took first place in every tournament he entered except for the Goodrich Invitational where he placed second. "He's just a hard worker. I say he probably worked harder than any heavyweight in the state," said Troy's first-year coach. Sam Amine. "When I watched him wrestle last year—and I want even coaching there—I saw the talent he had and I knew he could be a state champion."




