able. OCC coach John Briceland said.
"The fact we had a 10-stroke lead in the second round caused us to get our hopes up and overlook the talent Muskegon has."
Muskegon's Ryan Cutter was the state medalist with a 153 total after shooting 71 in the second round.

Also scoring for OCC in the 67-player field were Dave Dalek, who was 19th (168), and Errol Gomez, who was 27th (170).
The 54-hole regional will be played at Darby Creek near Columbus, but only the winning team advances to the national tournament June 2-6 in Pinehurst, N.C.
"We have to stay focused and put our best scores in every round," Briceland said. "This is the one that really counts, because the whole season points to the national championships. We have a team capable of winning this tournament."
The Raiders previously won the MCCA Eastern Conference championship and are ranked 10th in the National Junior College Athletic Association Division II poll.
