

# Falcons achieve 1st dual victory

Kelly Barenie and Theresa Derwinski were three-event winners Thursday as Farmington High earned its first dual-meet victory in girls track.

The Falcons recovered from a scoring deficit coming out of the field events to defeat host Walled Lake Central, 58-60.

Barenie won the 100-meter dash (13.5) and later the 200 (28.9), and she also anchored a Farmington victory in the 400 relay.

Nicole McDoniel, Lindsay Misch and Karinne Chatman combined with Barenie for a relay time of 55.7.

Derwinski won the 800 run (2:36.6) and ran the opening legs of what proved to be Farmington victories in the 3,200 and 1,600 relays.

She teamed with Sarah Miller, Betsy Lucksheiter and Kate Adams in the 3,200 (11:16) and with Brooke Foster, Natalie Dawson and Laura Lucksheiter in the 1,600 (4:09).

Ellen Adams was a double winner for the Falcons in the 1,600 and 3,200 runs with respective times of 5:45 and 13:14.

Chatman and Dawson also had individual victories in the long jump (14-0) and the 400 run (1:08.2).

Farmington's Brittany Dixon finished second in the shot put with a personal best of 32-2, and coach Bruce Brown cited Monique Bush's third-place finishes in the 100 and 300 hurdles.

"It was our first win and it was

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nice to get one," Brown said. "Kelly Barenie had an exceptional day, and Ellen Adams had a nice double in the mile and two-mile."

The Falcons are 1-3 in the Lakes Division and 1-4 overall.

### Spartans down Raiders

Livonia Stevenson remained unbeaten in dual meets Thursday at the expense of host North Farmington, 50-38.

Melissa Gratz had two of four individual victories for the Raiders, winning the shot put (36-6 1/2) and the discus (127-6) as she does in nearly every meet.

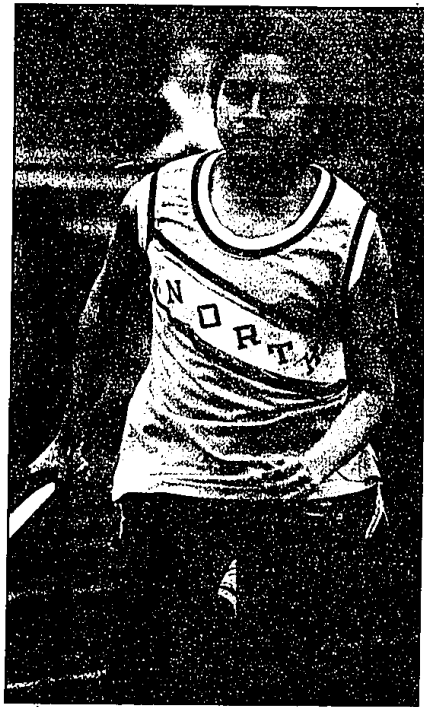
North's Tricia Traczyn won the high jump (4-10) and Monica Czerwinski the 200 dash with a personal best (26.8).

The Raiders could have won the 400 and 800 relays, according to coach Bill Plannell, but they dropped the baton in both races.

North received second-place efforts from Katie Callahan in the 100 hurdles (17.7), Traczyn in the 400 (1:08.8), Megan Douglas in the 800 (2:37.7) and Becky Naglik in the 3,200 run (12:38.7).

The Raiders also had personal bests and third places by Elena Spencer in the 1,600 run (6:50.1) and Vicky Hand in the 400 (1:07.1).

Stevenson is 4-0 in the Lakes Division and 7-0 overall; North is 1-3 and 2-3.

Jenn Kluska and Betsy Gignac scored two goals apiece Thursday in Farmington Hills Mercy's 5-0 defeat of visiting Harper Woods Region in girls soccer.

Laurin Hendrickson scored the other goal for the Marlinas, who are ranked No. 10 in the state. Betsy Gignac, Mary Gignac, Stephanie Kreeg and Colleen Soisson had assists.

Mercy finished with a 7-3 record in the Central Division and will play Birmingham Marian in the first round of the Catholic League playoffs Monday.

The Marlinas, who are 10-3 overall, fired 20 shots at the Region goal, and Mercy keeper Kelly Fuller earned the shutout with a seven-save effort.

"One of the things we had to work on was creating more chances for our forwards, and the offense kinda exploded today," Mercy coach Deepak Shivraman said.

"Nobody expected us to be where we're at. People had written us off long before, so we're really happy about the state ranking."

Shivraman had to adjust his lineup Thursday to compensate for the absence of injured sweeper Lynn Dreniak.

Lynn Digirolamo moved from outside defender to sweeper. Shannon Lirette moved from forward to defender and Rebecca Coury started on the defensive outside.

Marie Lentz and Stephanie Kreeg, both of whom have played defense much of the season, were moved forward to the midfield.

"With the offense and defense clicking today, we were able to get a good win," Shivraman said. "We're playing like a team and acting like a team. I'm definitely pleased."

# Raiders coast to win over Spartans

North Farmington continued its strong showing and to produce good results in boys track Thursday when it whipped host Livonia Stevenson, 52-46.

Ryan Kosutic and Mike Liefer contributed to three Raiders victories each, and Kirk Moundros, Andrew Wilder, Josh Callahan, Ernest Yeldo and Cornell Colbert weighed in with two apiece.

Liefer won the 100-meter and 200 dashes in 11.8 and 23.5, and he anchored the winning 1,600 relay team that included Dan Gabriel, Mike Millat and Yeldo.

Kosutic was first in the pole vault (10-6) and started the Raiders on their way to victories in the 400 and 800 relays.

Wilder, Moundros and Colbert passed the baton to a 46.2 conclusion in the 400, and Callahan, Yeldo and Colbert followed Kosutic for a 1:37.8 time in the 800.

Moundros also won the shot put (46-3 1/2), Wilder the long jump (18-8 1/4) and Callahan the 300 hurdles (43.9).

The Raiders had additional wins from Nick Pfeiffer in the

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high jump (5-6), Vince Mercader in the 110 hurdles (18.1) and Andrew Wantuck in the 1,600 run (4:49.6).

"With the team in general, we're coming along nicely," North coach Todd Schultz said. "We had a good heart-to-heart talk after the John Glenn meet, and they have really responded since then."

"We've had a lot of personal records, and we're looking forward to finishing out the year. The good attitude and good work habits are paying off."

North also had a pair of second-place finishes from Dan Jess in the 1,600 (4:59.6) and 3,200 (10:35.9) runs and Sam Long in the 800 (2:10.2).

The Raiders, who had their highest finish (seventh) at the Observers Relays in four years under Schultz, are 3-1 in the Lakes Division and 3-2 overall. The Spartans are 1-3 and 2-4.

## Hawks stay undefeated

Farmington Harrison will have a showdown with Walled Lake Western for the division title Tuesday at Harrison.
