Q. My husband left me and our three children many years ago. He never paid any years ago. He never paid any child support. The children are grown, and I raised and supported them myself. I am

living on Social Security and having a tough time making ands meet. Is there any way that, even after all these years, I can make him pay all the child support he owes? It tortainly would come in handy now.

A. I am not certain if there is a statue of limitations on how long it can be in order to collect back child support. After consulting with a Friend of the Court, she said she wasn't cortain either, but you should call the county courthouse where your divorce settlement occurred. The court will check to see if the order to pay child support is still on their books and if attempts were made to make your ex-husband pay the support. If you have the case number and the name of the judge who handled your divorce, that would be of great help. I'm sorry I don't have a definite answer for you. Make the telephone call to the court. You certainly have nothing to loss.
