## Hawks whip Warriors, win division title

Senior Nick Shaieb shattered his own school record in the discus Tuesday as Farmington Harison crushod Walled Lake Western in a showdown for the Western Division boys track title, 100-37.

Shaieb improved on his previous best throw by more than 13 feet when he throw the discus 178 foet, 2 inches. That's nearly 20 feet better than anyone else in Observerland.

He set the standard earlier this season when he threw the discus 162-7, and he broke that record last week with a 164-11 effort.
