

Raiders rally in 7th to beat Rocks

North Farmington rallied twice from deficits Monday to defeat host Plymouth Salem in softball, 12-10.

The Raiders trailed 10-8 but won the game with four runs in the top of the seventh without the benefit of a hit.

North's winning rally consisted of two walks, a hit batter, one error, a fielder's choice and two groundouts.

The Raiders had trailed 5-0 but regrouped with a six-run fifth. After the Rocks scored five in the bottom of that inning, North got two back in the sixth to make it 10-8.

Surprisingly, the Raiders had only five hits while giving up 16 to the Rocks. But two Salem pitchers combined to walk 12 and hit three.

Lakes Division and 13-14 overall. The loss left Salem at 11-15.
