

# Crib maker alters design to prevent infant deaths

A crib manufacturer is making design changes so its product can't be incorrectly assembled — as happened in White Lake which may have contributed to the death of an 8-month-old baby.

Cosco, Inc., of Columbus, Ind., will design its cribs so the bottom and side panels can no longer be interchanged, as happened in the household of Brandon Shirley, who died June 23.

"The changes will go into production next week," Carol Dingley, manager of corporate communications, said Friday.

Earlier in the week, the company and the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission issued a warning that any number of the 390,000 full size cribs manufactured after January 1995, may have been "mis-assembled," resulting injury or death.

The company said it had received more than 47 reports of cribs being "mis-assembled," including 27 reports of babies

becoming entrapped.

The company spokesman did not go into detail about the design changes. But she said the changes will make it impossible for customers to interchange the mattress platform with a side panel.

An incorrectly assembled crib was largely responsible in death of Brandon Shirley, according to White Lake police. The baby either slid or wiggled between the crib's bars and strangled when its head was caught, according to Det. Jon Kirken.

If the crib had been assembled correctly, the baby's body could not have fit between the bars of the crib side panels, said Kirken. But with the mattress platform — with wider spacing — used as a side panel, the baby's body was able to fit between the bars leading to tragedy, he said.

Federal regulations specify the spacing between bars on crib side panels, according to Kenneth P. Giles, spokesman for the product safety commission. But there are no such regulations on the mattress platforms, he said.

"Mis-assembling that crib is a very easy mistake to make," said Geoffrey N. Fieger, the Southfield attorney representing the baby's mother, Shannon Shirley. "We found retail stores that displayed the crib with the bottom interchanged with the side."

Fieger said the suit on behalf of the baby's mother was to be filed Friday or early next week. When his client purchased the crib, "it didn't even have a warning," said the attorney.

The company started issuing warnings with its cribs last year, said Dingley, "and that seemed to help."

Dingley said she had no way of determining where the idea of the design changes came from. One of those who recommended such changes to the product safety commission was Oakland County Medical Examiner Ljubisa J. Dragovic.

After the autopsy of Brandon Shirley, Dragovic said cribs could be designed so they could not be assembled incorrectly. The manufacturers of infant car seats had voluntarily made such design changes, he said.

The 1997 "Focus on Michigan" Photography Contest is sponsored by Oakland County Parks and MRPA. One photo will be selected at the state competition as "Best of Show" and awarded \$100.

The 11 Oakland County Parks are Addison Oaks near Oxford; Glen Oaks Golf Course in Farmington Hills; Groveland Oaks near Holly; Independence Oaks near Clarkston; Lyon Oaks in

Lyon Township; Orion Oaks in Orion Township; Red Oaks Golf Course, Waterpark and Sports Village in Madison Heights; Rose Oaks in Rose Township; Springfield Oaks Activity Center and Golf Course in Davisburg; Waterford Oaks in Waterford; and White Lake Oaks Golf Course in White Lake.
