



OCC trustee leads state group

Oakland Community College Trustee Anne V. Scott was elected July 18 to a one-year term as chairman of the Michigan Community College Association during the organization's annual conference in Traverse City. She is the first OCC representative to hold this position in the MCCA's 27-year history.

"Anne Scott is a dedicated trustee and an active member of

the MCCA," said OCC Chancellor Richard T. Thompson. "Her overriding concern for students and her interest in the opportunities presented by new technologies will serve Michigan's community colleges well as she takes her new post."

Based in Lansing, the MCCA represents all 28 schools in the Michigan community college network.

Elected to the Oakland Community College Board of Trustees in June 1992, Scott was voted OCC's delegate to the MCCA shortly after taking office. She has also served on the organization's executive board for the past three years.

Active in civic and philanthropic organizations, Scott is past president and life member of the Greater Royal Oak Cham-

ber of Commerce, past president of the Boys and Girls Club of South Oakland County, and past co-chair of the Michigan Women's Political Caucus. In addition to her service as an OCC trustee, she is chairperson of the Royal Oak Downtown Development Authority.

A Royal Oak resident, Scott is the mother of four and the grandmother of six.

Bloomfield Hills — Squirrel Road between Long Lake Road and Westview will be resurfaced with about 1,000 feet of the north end being reconstructed due to deteriorating pavement beginning in early August. A detour will route drivers along Adams and Square Lake roads until the project is completed in late September.

Farmington — Grand River will be widened to include a left turn lane and traffic signal at the Shiawassee intersection. Shiawassee, from Grand River to Farmington Road, will be closed during construction. Work is scheduled to begin anytime and be completed by Sept. 30.

Farmington Hills — Eight Mile, between Hulsted and Farmington roads, is being widened to five lanes. The project, which extends through the Farmington Road intersection, is expected to be completed Aug. 22. Intermittent lane closures are possible. Expansion of the Haggerty Connector (M-5) has closed 13 Mile Road, between Haggerty and Meadowbrook, until Aug. 1. Beam repair work has started on the 10 Mile bridge over I-96/I-275 with an expected completion in late October. The Farmington Road bridge over I-696 is shut down for deck replacement and will reopen Aug. 19. Traffic will be detoured along 11 Mile, 12 Mile and Orchard Lake roads and a lane shift will be in place for east and westbound I-696 travelers with intermittent lane closures.

Rochester — The first phase of the Sheldon Road Extension is under construction to create a bypass through the city of Rochester. The half-mile stretch of two-lane roadway is being constructed from east Second Street to Parkdale.

Rochester Hills — Hamlin Road is being reconstructed to a four-lane boulevard from M-59 to Crocker Road. The project, which is expected to be completed by the spring of 1998, will include the completion of the east-west link from the new M-59 ramp to various business facilities. The roadway is closed with detours across M-59 and Avon Road. Old Perch, between Avon and Walton Boulevard, is expected to be closed July 29 for an asphalt overlay project and reopen in mid-September. Access for Old Perch residents and necessary services will be permitted.

Southfield — J.L. Hudson Drive over M-10 is closed for repairs until Sept. 2. Traffic is detoured along the service drives. During construction, northbound M-10 will be completely closed from Greenfield to J.L. Hudson. Detours are posted. Hudson and the left lane of southbound M-10 will be closed. Greenfield bridge over the Northwestern Highway (M-10) is under construction for deck replacement with southbound Greenfield closed and traffic detoured along Pembroke. Lanes are expected to reopen Oct. 30, 1997.

Troy — Adams Road from the northern city limits in Troy to Madison will be repaved beginning this week. Northbound traffic will be detoured along Woodward and southbound travel will be reduced to one lane.

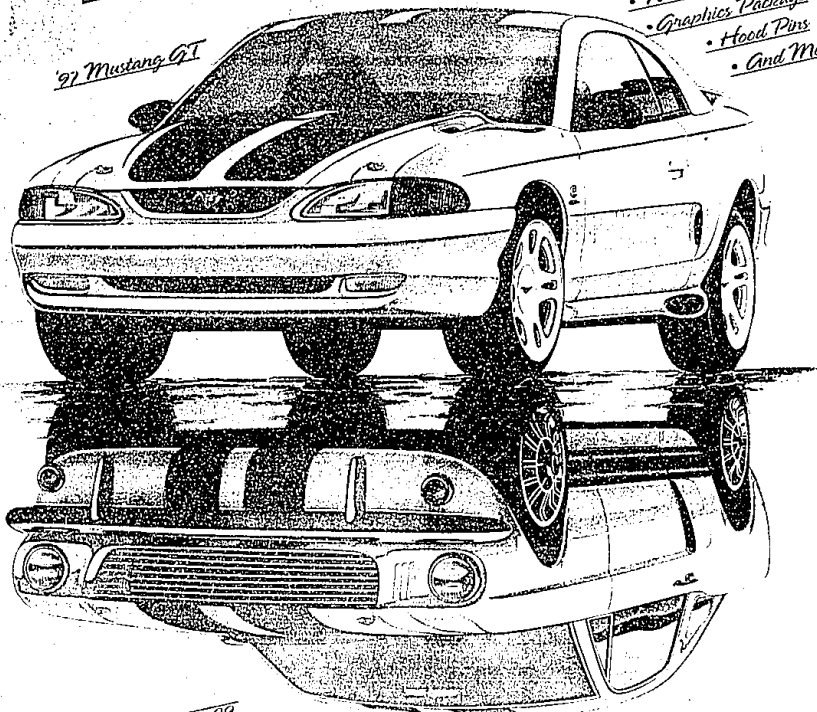
