

Bingham Farms — Due to deteriorating roads, all five miles of local roadway will be repayed with a layer of chip seal the end of July with a completion in late August. Thirteen Mile and 14 Mile roads will not be repayed since they are not local roadways.

OCC trustee leads state group

Oakland Community College Trustee Anne V. Scott was olect-ed July 18 to a non-year term as chairman of the Michigan Com-munity College Association dur-ing the organization's annual conference in Traverse City. She is the first OCC representa-tive to hold this position in the MCCA's 27-year history. "Anne Scott is a dedicated trustee and an active member of

the MCCA," said OCC Chancel-lor Richard T. Thompson.
