What to look for

■ Violent or aggressive behavior: Violence kills more children than infections and can-cer. Children mimic behavior they see. Keep kids away from violent movies and television shows.

■ Signs of depression: Decreased sleep or more sleep, decreased appetite, or a continu-ally sad mood are early signs. Suicide is a way out of painful situations such as poor grades or the loss of a friend. Anxiety and depression may be signs of phys-ical, emotional, or sexual abuse.
