Noe and Brown take over from David Poelke and Norman Dickson, who both retired. But it hasn't yet been determined whether they will have the exact same work duties.

"When you have two (new administrators), everything is up for grabs," Horn said.

At the meeting that the appointments were made, Noe and Brown also spoke about their eagerness to get going.

"I want to thank the Farmington Board of Education and Dr. (Bob) Maxfield for giving me the opportunity to work at one of the best school districts in the state of Michigan," Noe said. "I'm excited about it and look forward to this great opportunity."

According to Brown, she said she felt "a little sadness" in leaving the staffs at Farmington and

North Farmington high schools. She served all three high schools as an administrative assistant during the past two years.

"But I feel real excited to be at Harrison again..." said Brown, administrative intern at Harrison in 1994-95. "I pledge you my commitment."

The new appointee at North Farmington, Lanigan, was not able to attend the meeting. The successor to now-retired assistant Kathy Kalapos, Lanigan is in South Africa working on an educational project funded by a grant from GTE. Lanigan joins principal Deborah Clarke and assistant principal Donald Jones.

At the start of the board meeting, Maxfield gave brief summaries of the four appointees. "These are indeed the people who work as part of this team who make it (education) all happen."

Double ice rink proposal gets zoning board's OK

A proposal for a double ice rink training facility is a step further along in the planning process, but the proponent isn't revving up the Zamboni just yet.


Farmington Hills Zoning Board of Appeals granted Suburban Hockey a variance — with conditions — on parking for a proposed ice training facility on Freeway Park Drive during Tuesday's meeting.

The Hills-based company's site plan will go back for review to the Farmington Hills Planning Commission, which denied part of the initial plan because the proposal didn't meet the city's requirement for parking.

"Obviously, we're real elated to have their (zoning board of appeals) support," said Tom Anastos, who operates Suburban Hockey.

"I told someone that if we get this approval tonight I wouldn't mind walking into the building tomorrow and opening the doors to skate. There's a real urgency because the main season starts in September. (But) to throw out a date now would be premature and speculative."

Conditions for the variance include: improvements for a cross walk, a schedule of events be submitted to the city twice a year and no high school hockey games be played there.
