Russian studies flavor concert programs at Schoolcraft College

Students in Schooleraft College's Chamber Music and Pinno
Concerto Performance program
were hard at work practicing for
a series of upcoming concerts.

Many of the young pianists
recently returned from the St.
Petersburg Conservatory where
they participated in an intensive
three-week piano program with
students from across the country.
Donald Morelock, director of
Schooleraft College's piano and
applied music department, led
the contingent of seven students
to Russia. The program, for
which Morelock directs performance study, was sponsored by
Schooleraft College and the
International Fine Arts Institute
in Wisconsin.

"It was exciting because we'd
been there before," said Morelock. "We knew the faculty and
were more comfortable with the
situation to ask about technique
and the Russian sound. The
teachers treated the students
like professionals. In Russia,
there's great pride in being a
classical pianist. They major in
piano and music early. The
teachers explained their secrets,
how they developed their technique, how to develop the Russian sound.

Outstanding young pianist Sanjay Mody of Birmingham was one of the students polishing his performing skills under the direction of Schoolcraft faculty member Eugene Bossart last week. Mody took part in both the Schoolcraft and Russian piano studies. On Wednesday, Aug. 6, the 11 year-old will perform several classical works perfected in the intensive St. Petersburg Conservatory study program including sonates by Bestheven and Scrinitti, a Mozart concerte and Waltz in A Flat Major Chopin.

I liked working with the string quartet because it seems more exciting when you hear all of the instruments, said Mody referring to the two-week School-eraft program.

Mody has studied piano for five years, the last two years with Morelock. During his two trips to Russia, Mody studied privately with Tatiana Zagorowskaya, professor of piano at St. Petersburg Conservatory, "The second time proved a lot better for the musicality of my playing, the sound and quality," said Mody, "I was playing the Beethoven concerto quietly and the teacher told me to bring out the arpoggio. Now that I'm home, I'll try to put that into my playing."
Most of Russia's leading composers, musicians, painters, and writers lived in St. Petersburg. The St. Petersburg Conservatory, one of the oldest in Europe,

was founded in 1862 by Anton Rubonstein. Glinka, Rimsky-Korsakov, Tchaikovsky, Prokofief, and Shostaskovitch all studied or taught at the conservatory. The spirits of these composers made quite an impression on Mody, Brian Rodriguez and Joseph Heremans when they performed in the St. Fetersburg Conservatory Recital Hall and the palaces of Nevesky and Shermetiev.



The fact that this was Brian Rodriguez's first trip to Russia deeply affected the 20-year-old planist. Rodriguez, a Northville resident, recently completed his freshman year as a music major at Schoolcraft College.
"I learned a lot because it's a different culture and country so what I learned stuck with me,"

said Rodriguez. "All of the history there is really interesting and I was impressed by their appreciation for classical music."
Troy planist Joseph Horemans appreciated learning Russian technique. This was the 16-year-old Country Day School students second trip to the St. Petersburg Conservatory.

"I went back and saw a different appreach to the music," said Horemans. "I also like St. Petersburg, the monuments and buildings."
