plate number and the vehicle was stopped later that night by West Bloomfield police. The sus-pect was arrested on a charge of assault with intent to do great bodily harm and released the same night. Radzinski described her son as a passive teen who enjows com-

a passive teen who enjoys com-puters, tennis and golf. "He will go to college, probably to major in business. He is not aggressive at all," she said. "He is not one to fight, he would rather walk away. The police told him he did everything right that night."

The North Farmington High junior has a summer job in a local bakery. "His friends are scared to death. They were all traumatized by what happened, ljost hope that there is enough outrage here to charge this person as an adult," Radzinski soid. An adult conviction of assault with intent to do great bodlily harm, a felony, could bring a penalty of up to 10 years in jail.


