Annabelle B. Hubrecht, 100, died July 21 in West Bloomfield.

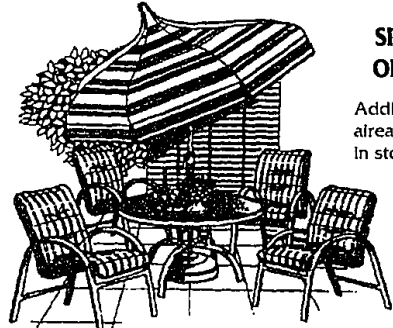

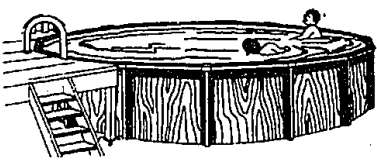
