income taxpayers, the credit is equal to 100 percent of the first \$1,000 of qualified expenses paid during the year plus 50 percent of the next \$1,000 of expenses (maximum credit of \$1,500).

The qualified expenses must be incurred on behalf of the taxpayer, the taxpayer's spouse, or a dependent. Expenses can qualify for the credit only if the student is at least a half-time student for at least one academic period during the year. The Hope Scholarship Credit is not available for the expenses of a student convicted of a federal or state felony drug offense.

Education Loan Interest. In repealing the tax deduc-tion for "personal interest," the Tax Reform Act of 1986 rendered most interest paid

on student loans nonde-ductible.

Now this situation is changing for some taxpay-

ers.

The new law allows tax-payers who pay interest on qualified higher education loans taken for themselves, their spouses, or any dependent (as of the time the debt was incurred) to deduct interest paid during the first 60 months (whether or not consecutive) in which interest payments are required on the loan. Effec-tive for payments of interest due after 1997, the maximum deductibles amounts

However, dependents of another taxpayer may not deduct interest they themselves pay, and married individuals must file a joint return in order de claim the deduction.

and Internal Seames for student loan interest are phased out for any taxpayer whose income exceeds a certain level

The phaseout ranges for the interest deduction start at over \$40,000 of modified AGI (\$60,000 on a join return), with full phase-out at \$65,000 (\$75,000 joint).

The phaseout levels will be indexed for inflation starting in 2003.
