

West Bloomfield teen charged with stalking

A 17-year-old West Bloomfield man was arraigned Monday in 47th District Court on a charge of aggravated stalking and now aits a pre-trial hearing later

this month.

Marselino Zoms plended not guilty at his arraignment, held before Magistrate James Brady.

Zoma is accused of stalking by his former girlfriend, an Il-year-old from Parmington Hills. He was freed on \$1,000 personal bond and ordered not to contact her.

According to a spokeswoman at 47th District Court, Zoma's pre-trial hearing is scheduled for

If Zoma is convicted of the
misdemeanor, he will receive a
one-year sentence andor \$1,000
fine, according to Farmington
Public Safety Director Mike
Wiggins.

been pre-arranged for Zoma to
turn himself in on Monday to
the public safety department,
and to be subsequently
arraigned.

A warrant had been received
from the county prosecutor on
Sopt. 12, with a letter then sent
to Zoma to appear at the station
within a week to face the charge.
But Zoma did not show up, and

even after police ordered him to
