Hunting is a safe recreational activity and the fall and winter seasons in Michigan offer plenty of terrific opportunities. Before venturing into the field be sure to take a minute to think about safety and to review the 10 Commandments of Firerum Safety. In case you forgot them, here they are. Clip them out and hang them in the cabin at hunting camp, so everyone will take a moment to think about safety in the field.

If Treat every gun as if it were loaded. You can never be too careful. Crack open the breech of every gun, especially the ones that are 'unloaded,' as soon as you pick it up.

Always keep your gun pun pointed in a safe direction and keep your finger off the trigger. Be aware of where your muzzle is pointed at all times and never point a gun at yourself or anyone else, even if it is unloaded. Don't put your finger on the trigger until the moment you are ready to fire the gun.
