Hawks rally to take T'birds in playoff opener

Dearborn Edsel Ford made its point in the first half Saturday. Then, Farmington Harrison made some points of its own.

After getting an early shock from the winting Thundrebirds, the heavily-favored Hawks rallied to score 53 unanswered points and whip Edsel Ford in a Class A regional football game, 56-21.

56-21. It seemed a great upset was in the making when the unranked Tbirds struck for a 14-0 lead in the first quarter and extended it to 21-3 in the second.

Those were the first points Harrison (10-0) has allowed in the first quarter and marked the first time it has been on the trailing end of the score this year.

"They came up and made big plays, they got us off our guard," said Harrison senior Zack Cornwell, who accounted for 24 points. "Usually, we're the ones making plays and taking control.

In equaling their highest point total of the season, the Hawks had plenty of offensive stars. Junior Mike Hond scored 14
