latest victims have been from out of state," said Bill Dwyer, Farmington Hills police chief. "As I said before, it makes Michi-gan look like the suicide capital of the country."

Dwyer has called for state legislation and a city ordinance in ceases. Such incidents are typically treated as homicides.

So far, investigation of three previous assisted suicides in the city has cost the department \$50,000 in personnel costs, which includes processing the scene and bringing in evidence technicians, Dwyer said.
