

ing minors to consume drugs or alcohol on the premises. Southfield-based defense attorney Rohn Mitchell pleaded not guilty on behalf of both clients.

Parker set a pre-trin hearing date for 2 p.m. Monday, Dec. 16. Personal bond was established at \$5,000 for each defendant and included several atipulations.

The couple was ordered to not have alcohol in their home until the case is sottled. They also cannot be "in the company" of minors (under age 21) other than their children, those who are in a neighborhood car pool and those connected to their employment. Alexander and Griffith are the parents of a FHIS student.

The aximum penelty for arraignment, said they were confident their side would eventual-

arraignment, said they were confident their side would eventually prevail.

"We're absolutely sure that this couple is going to be found absolutely innocent of these charges," Mitchell enid. He added that he based his comment on "our investigation at this point in time."

There's quite a bit of evidence against them, 'including statements collected from students at the party.
