

Falcon grapplers beat Clintondale, Lakeland, Franklin for fast start

Until next year, the Farmington wrestling team will be undefeated in dual meets. "That's not a boast, but a fact," says Farmington coach Al Beyer. The Falcons completed the 1997 portion of their schedule by winning a quad meet Dec. 6 at Livonia Franklin. Farmington was 3-0 with victories over Lakeland, Mount Clemens and Clintondale, and host Franklin, pushing the team's dual-meet record to an impressive 4-0-1. "It's going to stay that way until 1998," Farmington coach Al Beyer said, adding the Falcons don't have another dual meet until January. The fast start and perfect record has been a pleasant surprise for Beyer, who didn't expect that degree of success since the Falcons are void at several weights. "One thing I've noticed about this team is they don't give up," he said. "They all fight hard. Whether they're winning or losing, they fight right to the end, and that's something you can't teach."

"The record was just hard to imagine, when you know you're going to be giving up possibly 18 points a meet, being in that situation. It's a lot of hard work, guts and luck at the end. "If we can fill the couple holes we have, then we'll be OK. We're still working on it."

Farmington's toughest match was a 42-36 victory over Clintondale, which took a 24-0 lead before the Falcons rallied to win. "Clintondale was real tough in the lower weights, and we were tougher in the middle weights," Beyer said. "You can't afford to make any mistakes when you're down 24-0."

"They had one more void than we did. We're double-voided at heavyweight. If they had a
