U-M signing official

The University of Michigan has confirmed the signing of North Farmington senior left-hander Jeff Trzos to a national letter of intent to play baseball for the Wolverines.

Also signing were 6-foot-6 left-handed pitcher/outfielder Andy Brown of Richmond (Ind.) and right-handed pitcher/middle infielder Robert Korecky of Saline.

"I'm very pleased with this

group of players and I'm impressed with their potential as student athletes."

Michigan coach Geoff Zahn said, "but you never know how good your (recruiting) class will be until after the draft."

Zahn got three bats as well as a trio of arms. Brown (10-1, 1.69 ERA) hit .405-9-42 as a junior while Trzos batted .571 in the 1996 AABC Mickey Mantle World Series.

In the regional earlier in Coldwater, Trzos pitched a two-hit

shutout in the regionals and smacking consecutive home runs.

He is also a first-team All-Observer selection.

All-Academic pick

Ohio Wesleyan sophomore back Meghan Gago (Farmington Hills) was one of three members of the Battling Bishops' field hockey team named to the National Field Hockey Coaches Association Division III National Academic squad.

Gago, a starting back, has a 3.65 grade point average.

OCC to host women's college basketball tournament

Oakland Community College is scheduled to host its first women's Christmas Classic Basketball Tournament at the Highland Lakes campus.

"This tournament features two of the top teams (Lake Michigan and Owens (O.) CC) in the nation at the junior college level," tournament director Tod Hess said. "In addition, we have one of the top teams from Canada. We are looking for 12 good games this weekend."

The tournament opened today at 1 p.m. with Alpena CC playing Lake Michigan, the sixth-ranked team in NJCAA Division II. A second game at 3 p.m. features Henry Ford CC against Owens CC, which is currently tied for fourth in the most recent poll.

At 6 p.m. tonight, Oakland CC takes its 3-4 record against Sinclair (O.) with Niagara (Ont.) playing Lakeland (O.) at 8 p.m.

Tournament play runs through Saturday.

The Friday schedule has the losers from the first two games playing at 1 p.m. and the winners from the second two games meeting at 3 p.m.

The winners from the today's afternoon games will play Friday night at 6 p.m. with the winners from tonight's two games playing at 8 p.m.

The game for seventh place is scheduled for 1 p.m. Saturday, the fifth-place game for 3 p.m., the third-place game at 6 p.m. and the championship contest at 8 p.m.

Tickets will be available at the door for \$3 per session and \$5 for a day pass. Tournament passes cost \$13.
