# Gymnist leaping to success

Broatiful people of the world

watch out. Rence Flores hear't
hit her stride yet — though with
her emerging beauty, her ballerina-like poise and her athlete
prowess, the 11-year-old rhythmic gymnast is sure to take the
world by storms some day soon.

Meanwhite, she's content to
seek her place in the nation.

Gome spring, Flores, of Independence Township, expects to learn
whether or not she will qualify for
her first spot as a competitor on
the United States national team.

Flores, a Bailey Lake Elemenary fifth grader, has been participating in the sport as a member of the Oakland Rhythmics
Gymnastics team for four years.

The Oakland Rhythmics is a
parent-run organization that
trains and competes out of the
Good Shepherd Lutheran School
gym in Birmingham.

"I tried it and I liked it," Flores says of her interest in the

ties, rhythmic gymnastics, currently an all-female sport in the
United States, is performed on a
gym floor with the gymnast tumbling while manipulating ropes,
clubs, balls, hoops or ribbons.
As they execute their jumps,
swings, turns and figure-eights to
music, gymnasts are rated on a
scale of 1-20 with judges looking for
everything from fixed teyressions
to how many times the performer
drops her props. Routines are
chorographed by their coaches.
Flores, who says she has never
scored a 20, likes to challenge
her personal best at each meet.
Performing individually before
an audiene and judges can be
streasful, she admits.
"You get nervous" when the
props are dropped, she says. "You
pick it up and keep on going."
Flores says she is looking to
score a 16 at her next meet, to be
held in Los Angeles. "It's hard
but you get through it," she says

of the 20 or so hours she spends each week practicing after school, "ti's for the team."

Her practices include an hour of stretching exercises and warmups as well as ballet.

"The complicated thing about this is they have to master each element," says her mother Barbara. There's a zillion things they get graded on. They all have to be just so. Instead of saying, "I want to go to the Olympies," every meet she has a goal. She's really noted for her flexibility. She's very showy."

Usually Flores participates in six to seven meets per year. Those meets are typically held in Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois and other nearby states.

This year she will compete in what is called a Level 9 skill range. Those in levels 9 and 10 are eligible to compete for places at the national level. Typically, girls at that level are older than Flores, her mother says.

The public is welcome to attend a Michigan meet Feb. 7-8, from 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. at Good Shepherd Lutheran School on Lincoln in Birmingham. Membership in the 70-member team is open to girls interested in learning rhythmic gymastics, Barbara Flores says.
