They're priceless. It would be like asking what is the importance of having the Detroit Symphony here or what is the importance of having an opera here? This series is chamber music, but we need platforms and settings for all kinds of music both for the audience and the artists. It's very valuable to the area—culturally and in terms of nurturing artists.

How is Classics on the Lake unique?

They all have their own magic...St. Mary's – first of all, the setting is wonderful. If people have not been to the campus, they're always surprised when they get there. There's the lake and the chapel. There's a whole ambience there.

Do you think that classical music lovers in metropolitan Detroit could be more supportive?

I always think they can be more supportive. As an artist, I would never come to the conclusion that we are overfunded. But I don't want to put too resy a glow on it— there's a
