On Saturday, it was Boulerice's two goals that ensured Plymouth's 4-1 triumph over the Sarnia Sting. On Sun-day, Taylor scored twice in the first period to propel the Whalers to a 5-0 shutcut over the Kitchener Rangers. Robert Eache was in goal for win over Sarnia; he made 18 saves, Robert Holsinger got the shutout against Kitchener, mak-

ing 15 saves.

Against Sarnia, David Legwand contributed a goal and an assist, Yuri Babonko scored a goal and both Sergei Fedetov and Taylor had two assists.


