fines of \$25-\$100.

The downtown district is our field, "Iamented Farmington Hills teenager Russell Fortig, one of a dozen or so skateboarding enthusiasts who attended the council meeting." If we can't go there, then where to?

That is the question skateboarders and their parents can help answer, said Farmington City Manager Frank Lauleff jowing the seasion. He suggested a committee be formed to study the issue of locating safe, but legal, areas for teens to perfect their various jumps and tricks.

According to Lauhoff, theower of a large, private parking lot might help provide kids with a suitable skateboarding site. The optimum place to be is on private property. Mayba someone who supports the sport can help net up a course.

Mayor Mary Bush applauded the teens for their input into what one resident called a "hot potate" issue. "But I feel we've been left with no choice."

said Mayor Pro-Tem Bill Hartsock to the audience. 'Both yours and those either walking or driving through the (Downtown Farmington Center) parking lot." Hartsock resterated that the ordinance still permits skateboarding in non-downtown areas, on public property and on private property where permission has been granted. Rollerblading will still be allowed downtown.

Adults on both sides of the issue also addressed the council. Farmington Hills resident Charlene Vukonich, the parent of a skateboarder, read a statement urging the council to consider alternatives to a ban. "Skateboarding is an enjoyable activity to those that are less interested in regimented sports," Vukonich said. "... It is athletic, and the kids p-natice hard to

improve their skills. Doesn't this sport have the same value as more expensive, established activities?"

Metrobank's Marianne Helle: Metrobank's Marianne Helle-buyck expressed concerns that, eventually, someone driving through the bank parking lot would "run over" one of the youths who skateboard there. "I'm scared to death every time I; see them in the lot." Joan Harrison, another Farmierton business owner and resi-ington business owner and resi-

Joan Harrison, another Farmington business owner and resident, also said the sport is inappropriate for a downtown area, But she suggested a task force be formed with the cities of Farmington and Farmington Hills and Farmington achool district to "examine other locations to be designated for skateboard use."

Following the meeting, council member JoAnno McShane encouraged the youngsters to get their parents interested in Joining a committee to explore the subject.

"We want to see the kids enjoy their sport and have fun," McShane said. "But we want them to do it safely. I'll be glad to help them if they want to put together a committee."
