Man closer to obtaining pistol records from police

Fred Mager is inching closer toward obtaining Michigan State Police pistel inspection records.

The state Court of Appeals denied the State Polices' request for a rehearing last week. The second highest court ruled 3-0 that the Redford Township regident was entitled, under the Freedom of Information Act, to the records. "My attorney (Daniel Bambery of DeWitt) has a date for March 18 in Ingham Circuit Court for summary disposition," said Mager, who wants the recording order to enlist pistol owners in a cam-

paign for less restrictive licensing laws.

The licensee must never have been requitted for a crime by reason of insanity and not under a court order of legal incapacity or involuntary commitment.
