Joan Lunden, former Good Morning America host and author of books on healthy living, will be guest speaker at the annual CHOICES event scheduled for 11 a.m., Wednesday, March 4, at Adat Shalom Synagogue, 29001 Middlebelt, Farmington Hills. CHOICES is the annual Allied Jewish Campaign community outreach event and fund-raising luncheon sponsored by the Jewish Federation Women's Campaign and Education Department.

For nearly 20 years, Lunden hosted Good Morning America in addition to many prime-time TV specials called "Behind Closed Doors With Joan Lunden."

Her specials toured the CIA headquarters, Betty Ford Clinic and the Pentagon, among others. She has hosted programs on parenting and appeared in parenting videos. She is the single mother of three daughters.

Among the honors and awards she has received are: Yeshiva University Spirit of Achievement Award, YWCA Outstanding Woman's Award, New Jersey Division on Civil Rights Award and Baylor University Outstanding Woman of the Year.

The National Mother's Day Committee selected her as the Outstanding Mother of the Year in 1982-1983 for her dedication to motherhood.

She has written three books: "Good Morning I'm Joan Lunden," "Joan Lunden's Healthy Living" and "Joan Lunden's Healthy Cooking." CHOICES chairwoman is Susie Pappas. Susie Leemaster is associate chairman and Hannah Moss, adviser.

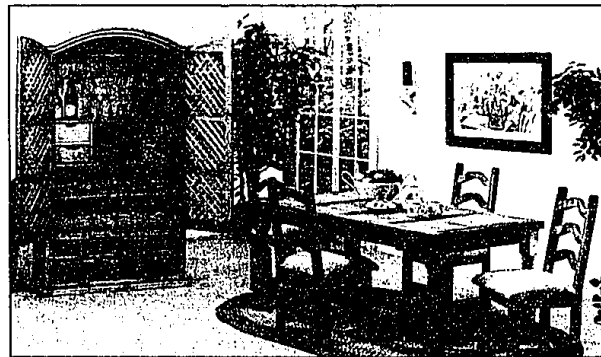
