H building spells fitness for OCC

For many county residents, H Building — for health and physi-cal education — is their chief contact with Oakland Communi-ty College's Orchard Ridge Cam-

contact with Oakiana Community Collego's Orchard Ridge Campus.

"I call it the barometer. The
public uses this more than any
other building," asid Leonard
Cole, facilities manager of the
building that houses the swimming pool, diving pool, triplesized gym and exercise room.

High schools, both public and
private, and community groups
can rent the facilities when they
aren't in use by OCC classes and
faculty. And it was particularly
good news when the college completed phase II of renovations for
a building that might have been
partly closed without an infusion
of voter-approved money.

A Feb. 28 official ribbon-cutting marked the formal completions. H Building is in the northwest corner of the campus, which
overlooks I-bes' freeway between
Orchard Lake and Farmington
roads in Farmington Hills.

Actually, Cole said, classes
have been using the facilities
some weeks.

\$13,000 reconstruction of its

"The aluminum lining had deteriorated and leaked badly," Cole said.
"It would have been closed indefinitely if the millage hadn't passed," added George Cartsonis, college information officer. That resonated in Formington and Farmington Hills."
Voters approved 0.8 mill (80 cents per \$1,000 of taxable value) in mid-1995 for seven years, pumping about \$30 million in new funds. The now money is dedicated to new programs, renovations, new equipment and student aid — but not to salaries and jobs.
A bulkhead separates the swimming pool from a 16-footdeep diving pool used to teach diving, scuba diving and kayaking.

Phase II was \$1 million in work on the rest of H Building.
Half of that went into getting rid of the old, separate mechanical system theating, ventilating and air conditioning) and tying H Building to the rest of the campus. That, said Cole, will save on maintenance work.
The second half of phase II went to these renovations:
Blocker rooms — 25 percent more lockers, new plumbing,


