POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

The following are police and fire incidents that occurred in Farmington and Farmington Hills during the past week.

FIRE

In Farmington Hills:
Police put out a stove fire at the Best Western Hotel on 12 Mile around 5:48 p.m. March 8. The stove was engulfed when the officer arrived. He used a dry extinguisher to put the fire, which caused \$500 damage.

CIGARETTE THEFT

In Farmington Hills:
A man stole 12 packs of cigarettes from Mobil gas station on Orchard Lake and 13 Mile at 6:20 a.m. March 6. The thief is described as a white male between 25-35, with shoulder-length straight brown hair. He was wearing a gray, purple and blue nylon jacket. He was accompanied by another white man with a brown goatee, glasses and wearing a gray jacket. Eight packs of Marlboros were stolen from the Mobil station on Orchard Lake and 12 Mile a few minutes later March 6. This time, a woman and a man entered the station with one asking for directions to Fairlane Town Center. After the pair left, the clerk noticed the cigarettes were missing.

VANDALISM

In Farmington:
A 51-year-old Farmington resident reported that someone vandalized her car between 7-9:25 p.m. Saturday while it was parked in the south lot at the T.J. Maxx store, 33049 Grand River.

She said about \$250 in damage was caused to the driver side mirror. All four hubcaps, totaling \$200 in value, were also reportedly stolen from the car.

BREAK-INS

In Farmington Hills:
A compact disc player and radar detector were stolen after the door was pried open on a

1997 Honda Civic parked at Muirwood Apartments between March 5-6, causing \$1,000 damage.

An AM/FM CD radio, speakers and 40 CDs were stolen after a vent window was pried open on a 1991 Ford parked at Muirwood Apartments between March 5-6, causing \$500 damage.

A cellular phone, stereo CD player, computer and computer scanner were stolen after the lock was popped on a 1996 Chevy Tahoe parked at Independence Green Apartments between March 5-6, causing \$500 damage.

A Sony CD player, Clarion speakers and two Solobovic speakers were stolen after a window was broken on a 1991 Dodge Shadow parked on Montclair and Stockton between March 5-6, causing \$250 damage.

Stereo equipment and CDs were stolen after a window was broken on a 1996 Nissan Maxima parked at Crosswinds Condominiums March 8, causing \$300 damage. A cellular phone was also stolen after the drivers window was broken on a GMC Jimmy parked at Crosswinds Condominiums March 8.

DRUG THEFT

In Farmington Hills:
Eight 8-10 milligram injections of Valium were stolen from emergency crash carts at Botsford Hospital between Jan. 5 and March 6. The injections were stolen in separate incidents.

THEFTS

In Farmington Hills:
Police arrested two girls, ages 16-17, in connection with a series of thefts in the girls' locker room at Harrison High March 6. A woman's wristwatch, purse, necklace and two rings were

stolen. Some items were later recovered in a book bag of one of the teens. Another teen was carrying the purse and wearing the rings.

Five maple trees worth \$4,000 were stolen after they were cut from the south side of an Orchard Lake residence Feb. 13. The trees were 6 feet tall.

Three fax machines were stolen from three doctors' offices in the same building on Orchard Lake near Leeland between March 6-9. A TV was reported stolen in another doctor's office.

In Farmington:
A 33-year-old Oak Park woman told police her purse was missing when she went back to retrieve it about 11:30 a.m. Sunday at the Grand River Ram's Horn.

The woman said she put the purse down on the bathroom floor while helping her young daughter use the facilities. She remembered she left the purse behind, but it was gone when she came back. It contained about \$200 in cash, plus miscellaneous credit cards and a checkbook.

DRUNKEN DRIVING

In Farmington Hills:
Police arrested a Livonia man, 47, for drunken driving on Grand River near Oxford at 7:45 p.m. March 6. Police stopped the vehicle after getting a tip from another motorist. The patrol car followed the 1985 Dodge Ram into Botsford Hospital after the driver didn't stop. The driver explained he was trying to get his passenger to the hospital. The man injured his knee, the driver said. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .21 percent. It's illegal to drive in Michigan with a blood alcohol level of .10 percent or higher. Hills police arrested four people for drunken driving March 6-9.

In Farmington:
Police arrested a 28-year-old Ferndale man for drunken driv-

ing following a traffic stop about 2:30 a.m. Saturday near Grand River-Nine Mile. He was spotted traveling 92 in a 35 miles per hour zone, on westbound Grand River, and swearing within his lane. The driver's blood alcohol level was .109 percent. A hearing was scheduled for Monday in 47th District Court.

LAWN JOBS

In Farmington Hills:
A vehicle drove over the lawn at 13 residences on Marc Drive, Lorraine and Scott Drive between March 6-7. The vehicle is believed to be a passenger car. Damage estimates were not available.

FRAMES LIFTED

In Farmington Hills:
A total of 16-18 eyeglass frames worth \$3,000 were stolen from Eyes Right Optical on Grand River and Tuck around 1 p.m. March 6. An employee said a couple came into the office and the man was asking questions about an insurance card. The woman was left unoccupied. All the designer frames stolen were women and included Armani, Nicole Miller, Gucci and Dakota Smith.

In Farmington Hills:
Police are investigating after two money bags with more than \$1,600 were missing from the McDonald's on Orchard Lake and 14 Mile between March 5-6.

DOMESTIC ASSAULT

In Farmington Hills:
A woman and her friend were taken to Botsford Hospital after they were punched by the victim's estranged husband outside a neighbor's home March 8. The husband punched his wife repeatedly and pulled out a clump of hair. She tried to run home but was chased down and punched again. The friend tried to push the man away when he turned around and punched her in the face. He then ran away.
