thought would be there. It's something that presented itself out of the blue."

Pesci had agreed to help in the role of a U-D volunteer assistant coach, working with the outfielders and pitching batting practice to the younger players. "It's kinda funny, he said. "All of a sudden, I'm back playing with these guys."

Miller was pleased when he learned the hard-hitting center fielder would be back in a U-D uniform again.
