

POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

The following are police and fire incidents that occurred in Farmington and Farmington Hills during the past week.

VANDALISM

In Farmington Hills: The passenger side window was smashed on a 1992 Saturn parked on Andover between March 26-27, causing \$500 damage.

In Farmington:

Approximately \$600 worth of damage was done to three street lamps outside a business in the 24000 block of Drake. According to reports, rocks were thrown at the lights between Sunday and Monday.

THEFT

In Farmington Hills: Two cellular phones were stolen from a 1998 Chevy Suburban parked in a garage on Foxcliff between March 26-27. A cellular phone and woman's

FLEEING AND ELUDING

In Farmington Hills:

Police arrested a Farmington Hills woman, 63, for fleeing and eluding and obstructing a police officer after refusing to stop on eastbound 13 Mile near Drake March 29. Police tried to stop the 1995 Toyota Camry after it was tailgating and then speeding past the patrol vehicle. The suspect's vehicle reached speeds of 70 miles an hour before stopping for a red light on Middlebelt where the officer was able to talk to the driver. When asked why she didn't stop, the driver replied, "I don't have to." She refused to leave the vehicle and became increasingly aggressive, police reports said. The officer used freeze spray in order to get her from the vehicle. She continued to be abusive during booking, kicking an officer in the leg.

HEROIN POSSESSION

In Farmington Hills:

Police arrested a Detroit woman, 38, after finding paper containing heroin during a traffic stop on southbound Orchard Lake and Ridgeway at 10:38 p.m. March 29. Police stopped the 1979 Ford Thunderbird after it struck the median. Police found a poorly empty 40-ounce bottle of Mickey's malt liquor. She had a blood alcohol level of .27 percent. A small piece of paper fell from her sock, which was folded over and contained heroin.

CONCEALED WEAPON

In Farmington Hills:

Police arrested an Ypsilanti woman, 23, after finding a 9-millimeter Glock in the 1993 Ford Explorer she was driving on westbound Eight Mile and Inkster March 30. Police stopped the vehicle on suspicion it may have been stolen. When asked if she was carrying a gun, the woman said yes. The gun was in her purse. She said she was a dancer in Detroit and carried the

weapon out of fear of a former boyfriend. She was also carrying \$1,344 in cash.

BUSINESS BURGLARY

In Farmington Hills:

Police arrested a Farmington Hills man, 42, for drunken driving after the 1992 Ford Ranger he was driving was involved in an accident on Eight Mile and Grand River March 28. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .18 percent.

ARSON

In Farmington Hills:

Police arrested a Hills woman, 28, for burning personal property after she tried to set a queen-sized mattress on fire during an argument with her estranged husband March 27. The woman's two children, ages 6 and 4, were sleeping on the bed at the time. Police found the sheets and mattress were damaged with a 1-foot by half-foot burn mark. The woman said she didn't intend to

harm her children, putting out the fire herself. She said the argument started with her husband after he threatened to throw her out of the house. She lit the fire with her 10-month-old daughter in her arms. The children were turned over to their grandmother and uncle.

ASSAULT

In Farmington Hills:

A Hills woman, 31, told police she was punched in the jaw and dragged down the driveway by a neighbor who was joined in the assault by a man on Rhonawood March 28. When questioned by police, the neighbor said she was assaulted by the victim and her sister. Police told both parties—who appeared to have been drinking—to stay away from each other.

DOG BITE

In Farmington Hills:

A 6-year-old girl was treated for dog bites on her stomach, right hand, wrist and index finger March 27. The girl was bit by a mixed breed dog, which has been vaccinated.

RAPE

In Farmington Hills:

A woman believes she was drugged by a man who sexually assaulted her at his apartment March 7. The man drove the woman home from a nightclub where she said she began to feel fuzzy. She woke up in his apartment nude, with him lying next to her. She pushed him away, got dressed and ran out of the apartment. Blood tests are pending for the presence of drugs.
