

## POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

The following are police and fire incidents that occurred in Farmington and Farmington Hills during the past week.

## DRUG POSSESSION

**In Farmington Hills:** Police arrested a Detroit woman, 28, after finding two rocks of crack cocaine and 2.5 grams of marijuana during a traffic stop on Halsted and Grand River April 5. ## DRUNKEN DRIVING

## In Farmington Hills:

The man, treated for injuries at Botsford Hospital and released, hit speeds

up to 80 mph on Grand River and was attempting to turn onto westbound I-96 when he lost control.




