

POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

The following are police and fire incidents that occurred in Farmington and Farmington Hills during the past week.

FIRE

In Farmington Hills: Firefighters put out a smoldering garage fire on Jefferson with a garden hose April 26. The fire started from a homemade wood burning stove. Firefighters also put out a stove fire at an Inkster Road residence April 24.

OPEN INTOXICANTS

In Farmington: Police stopped a car driven by a 23-year-old White Lake man who ran a red light 12:30 a.m. Saturday at the intersection of Grand River-Farmington roads. The odor of intoxicants was evident to officers, who then heard the sound of bottles rattling at the feet of the vehicle's passenger, a 24-year-old Commerce Township man.

The passenger admitted the beers were his and was issued a citation for having open intoxicants in a motor vehicle.

DOGHOUSE MAD

In Farmington Hills: The owner of Grooming Tails on Northwestern Highway told police a woman grabbed a handful of dog biscuits and threw them at him and other employees at 8:30 p.m. April 25. The owner said the woman became angry when she was told they couldn't have her dog groomed by noon as she demanded.

DOG COMPLAINT
