Midwest Farmingtons

America's middle west claims five (not counting Michigan) Farmingtons. The name is often a reflection of the region's mujor occupation. The farming states of Missouri, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota and Iowa each has a

With a population of 6,600 people, the town has an airport, two area hospitals, and its own home page on the World Wide Web. Its largest employer is the Farmington Correctional Center. The town was incorporated in 1830 but this year is celebrating the bicentennial of its founding. Seventy miles south of St. Louis. Farmington has six public and three parchial schools. Despite having just 700 residents, Farmington, lowa has three schools and six churches. Attracting the farming families of southeast lowa, the town has a Pioneer Museum and an annual Strawberry Festival.
