Overlay deaths can occur when the body of an adult or older sibring sleeping with the infant compresses its face into a mattress or the cushions of a couch or chair.

campaign promoted by the Michigan SIDS Alliance reminding parents that infants sleeping on their
back are loss likely to fall victim to
crib death, or Sudden Infant Death
Syndrome.

The frequency of positional asphyxiation deaths in Oakland County has been documented by the medical examiner's office in a study from February, 1992, through April, 1996. A study by Dragovic's staff disclosed 22 positional asphysiation deaths in Oakland and nine more in counties where Oakland pathologists are involved in autopsies.

Since the end of the study in 1994, there have been eight more positional asphysiation deaths either in Oakland or handled at county hospitals.
