

POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

The following are police and fire incidents that occurred in Farmington and Farmington Hills during the past week.

GOLF CART CRASH

In Farmington Hills:
A 6-year-old boy and an 8-year-old girl received minor scratches and cuts after driving a golf cart through a glass door window at Tom Holzer Ford on 10 Mile and Haggerty May 11. The two children got on the cart, which had a key in the ignition. The boy hit the gas pedal and the cart went forward through the door before coming to rest at a desk inside. The children's father told police he was inside and saw the children get into the cart. By the time he went outside to get them out, the cart

already started moving.

Police also found two marijuana cigarettes and other drug paraphernalia in the vehicle.

A Westland police officer found a man slumped over the wheel of

a 1997 Mazda Miata on westbound I-696 at 3 a.m. May 10. The car had massive front end damage. When asked where he thought he was, the man replied "Howell or Brighton." The driver had a blood alcohol level of .16 percent.
