

Terek runner-up in Big Ten decathlon

The dreaded 1,600-meter run is the final event of the two-day decathlon and Michigan State University freshman Paul Terek wasn't exactly looking forward to it.

But with a Big Ten individual title at stake Saturday at Ohio Stadium in Columbus, the Livonia Franklin Hill product was trailing leader Greg Gill of Wisconsin — from what he was told — by only 300 points.

"I needed to beat him by 300 seconds," said Terek, who knows a little about calculating being a mechanical engineering major.

As it turned out, Terek ran the race of his life in 43:30.4, not bad for a guy, who in high school, never ran a competitive race over 400 meters.

He was 31 seconds better than Gill, but it didn't matter. The Wisconsin senior had built up an insurmountable lead prior to the 1,600.

As it turned out, the point dif-

ferential was a little bit wider than estimated. Gill scored 7,325 points to Terek's 7,206.

"Honestly, I can't say I enjoyed the two days, but I was happy with the way I performed," Terek said. "It was a great learning experience."

The decathlon is difficult. You have a lot of contact with the other athletes. I wasn't really competing against them. Instead, I was running against the clock and the tape-measure."

For a guy who is just getting his feet wet in track and field's most glamorous but grueling event, Terek put on an impressive showing in his debut.

On the first day, the 6-foot-2, 185-pound senior had built up an early lead on the 100-yard dash (11.20); fourth in the 1600-yard shot put (nearly 42 feet); fifth in the high jump (personal best 6-

1 1/2); and sixth in the long jump (21-4).

Already the MSU indoor and outdoor record holder in the pole vault (17-3). Terek blew away the field on the second day in his specialty by clearing 17-2.

He added a pair of seconds in javelin (171 feet) and 1,600, a fourth in the discus (116.9) and a sixth in his weakest event, the 110 hurdles (16.60).

"The first day I was a little down after the 100," Terek said. "The second day I had a bad discus throw. I knew I could get better. I wasn't keeping my arm back, and I forgot my technique." But nothing compared to the 1,600, virgin territory for Terek.

"I felt tight; I felt horrible, but actually it didn't hurt as bad as the 400," he said. "I was afraid of not finishing. But my coach set up a plan where I'd run 35 seconds each 200. Once I stopped thinking about it, I was OK."

By virtue of his second-place

Big Ten finish, Terek has qualified for the Junior Nationals in the decathlon (and the pole vault) in Edwardsville, Ill.

He'll continue to train in East Lansing, spend weekends at home refurbishing his 1983 Ford Falcon and contemplating thought of "backing out" to play football for MSU in the fall.

Under orders from MSU track coach Darroll Gatson, Terek was not allowed to compete in football his freshman year.

"They already have all the spots taken for the preferred walk-ons, so I can't try out until school starts," Terek said. "But they said they'd love me to come out. I guess just want to know where I stand. I really wanted to play last year."

But with a top-two finish at the Junior Nationals in either discipline, Terek will be invited to compete later this summer in the Junior World Championships in France.

Troy claims trophy in Ambrose Relays

Kormit Ambrose was the most energetic 87-year-old in the world. Ambrose threw a "party" for over 300 people one day in May. But his party was a little different than food and drink and mingling. Ambrose's gala is the annual Ambrose/Eccentric Relays, a track and field meet involving 12 Oakland County high school track teams.

"At track meets you always find the nicest people. And going to a meet is like going to a party, and I like parties," Ambrose said.

The 31st Relays turned out to be quite a bash at Troy High School emerged victorious on a hot Tuesday evening at Bloomfield Hills Lathrup.

Troy scored 94 team points followed by Rochester with 55 and Birmingham Brother Rice with 52.

The Relays are sponsored by The Eccentric and coordinated by Ambrose, a track coaching legend at Birmingham Seaholm in the 1950s and '60s and a long-time track and field official. Ambrose invites a number of top coaches to help coordinate. They have completed seasonal competition. The timing of the event — following everything but the state meets — allows coaches to give those athletes who aren't state qualifiers the opportunity to be a part of a major event.

Troy, a five-time Relays win-

ner and most recently in 1995, helped its cause by notching first place in five of 13 events including the triumphant pole vault of Brad Wright, Derek Woghorst and Matt Graves who threw for a combined 131 feet, 2 inches.

"We ran very well today," Troy coach Scott Plyner said. "I was very pleased. We ran with a lot of these teams at the Lathrup Relays and didn't do nearly as well."

"I had 23 different kids competing today. It's nice to get the kids in."

Troy also boasted the winning 300-meter relay team of Scott Plyner, 1,600, sprint medley and shuttle hurdle relay teams.

"This was a great way to end the season," Plyner said. "Track seasons go up and down and can be frustrating at times, so it's good to come out here and end on a good note."

Ambrose has no plans of ending to organize the event any time soon.

"When it's gonna end, I don't know. I don't know how long I'm gonna last," Ambrose said with a chuckle.

"The hardest part, of course, is getting things organized. But we always have a lot of good workers, and we put on a good show."

"I think the coaches and athletes enjoy it. Any time you can do something that kids enjoy, that's always important."
