Spearheading the project at the Farmington district school was student Christopher Britten, the youngest member of a local Civil War Round Table group. Under his leadership, the rest of the class became enthusiastic about preserving a Civil War

flag.

Meyers' class then looked at the "Civil War Flags of Michigan" poster and began researching those depicted battle flags, subsequently deciding on which one to try to help preserve.

The class decided on the flag that was carried by the Second Michigan Volunteer Infantry Regiment during the infamous war between the Union and Confederacy. Only a tattered fragment of that flag survives today.

Several fund-raising endeavors helped them raise the money, including sales of the school's monthly newsletter, the Becchview Buzz.

Money also was generated by a school wide penny drive and a read-a-thon, held during the annual Book Parade.

"Save the Flags" is an effort by the Michigan Capitol Committee and the Michigan Historical Museum to preserve Civil War battle flags of Michigan that have been damaged over the years due to constant exposure to light, dirt, humidity and crowding when they were on display in the Capitol rotunda.
