## Men and the Church

Certain wealthy men of New York recently determined to put the claims of the church before the business men of the United States. They began this movement because they felt that the brainy men of the day, the professional men, the business men, the farmers, the whole round of successful men, really believe in the principle that underlies the church. All men are naturally religious. They also felt that the reason why so few men took an active interest in the work of the church was because the church had in part failed to put the matter before the men in a big, attractive, intelligent way. Once let men see the bigness of the real platform of the church, and then give them a chance to plan large methods to carry it out and few men can or wish to resist such an appeal.

With this idea originated the "Men and Religion" movement that has caused and is causing such a stir right now in New York, Buffalo, Detroit, Chicago, San Francisco. They plan to reach the small, rural towns later.

Several of our business men got together and said, "Why need we call in outside business men, or wait for them, we are as desirous as any New York millionaire, even as J. Pierp himself, to encourage broad-minded intelligent efforts to keep up the moral life of our citizenship at the highest possible point. Then let us organize a movement of our own."

The result of this was a very mild pledge that has been circulated and signed by scores of men in our village and vicinity this week. The pledge reads as follows:

"I shall show my interest in a Men's Bible Class movement by attending the meetings of such a class as often as I find it convenient, Sunday mornings, 11:30 to 12:30, in the vestry of the M. E. church; it being understood that the constitution, details of organization, election of officers, and all other matters pertaining to the work or management of such a class will be left entirely in the hands of the class."

The first meeting for organization will be held next Sunday at 12:00 sharp in the M. E. church vestry. The aims, purposes, plans and subjects for study and discussion will be brought up at this first meeting. The aim of the men is to keep the platform of this class as broad as possible, absolutely non-sectarian and unrestricted. If you can spare the time, come, every man's presence and interest will help.

### JAPANESE MATCH FACTORIES.

The Japanese have developed the extensive manufacture of matches in China. There are factories at Tientsin, Peking, Hangkow, Shanghai and other places. The victors do not allow the erection of several factories in the same town, so that each factory has a kind of local monopoly. The factory at Hangkow employs 3,600 hands and produces fifty or sixty tons daily.
