A Farmington fathor made sure his 15-year-old daughter understood that half a pizza costs as much as a whole one. The incident began about 5 p.m. July 8 when a driver for the Domino's store at 31806 Grand River doilvered a cheese and pepperoni costing about \$10.40 in the 23600 block of Béncon.

The teen took the pizza inside, then returned it a few minutes later, saying she had no money. The driver opened the box, finding half the pizza gone, but the girl had already closed the door. He knocked, but got no answer.

The father, reached by police July 6, said his daughter had been at home with an unknown friend. He took her to the store, where she paid and apologized, police said.

In a separate incident at the Shell station, 37376 Grand River, a clerk found a humidor containing 40 cigars worth about \$80 missing after a confirmation with five males.

She said the five people, four of whom appeared intoxicated drove into the station in a large Sears rental truck and a sport utility vehicle, parked and entered the store.

They purchased saveral items, including a lottery ticket, then started arguing with the clerk 43, that the lottery ticket, then \$250 winner.

When she told them no, they complained and demanded money. She told them to leave and they became angier, as she threatened to call police, which was when one of the five persuaded the others to leave.
