Blues-9 win: The South Farmington Blues 9-year-old team captured first place in the NFWB Fourth of July tournament, defeating Fort Wayne (Ind.), 6-3, in the championship game. The victory avenged the only loss suffered by the Blues in the seven-team tournament, which encompassed five games. Stephen Doty pitched four scoreless innings in the title game with Brian Noble going the last two for the save. The Blues broke open a scoreless game in the fourth when Andy Lentz singled, stole second and scored on a Brooks Tuyn single. Chris Egedy and Andy Harris followed with RBI singles. Egedy had a two-run bases-loaded single in the fifth and Noble drove in the Blues' final run in the sixth. Fort Wayne had defeated South Farmington, 11-3, earlier in the tournament. Fort Wayne, fifth-place finisher in last year's 8-year-old World Series, loaded the bases in the sixth. Shortstop Lentz caught a line drive and second baseman Tuyn tracked down a popup to preserve the win. South Farmington defeated NFWB, 11-0, Saline, 8-0, and Northville, 18-1 in other games behind the hitting of catcher Jon Castine plus outfielders Paul Greenwood, Jeff Kaberline and Kevin Raftery. The Blues are managed by Rick Tuyn and assistant coaches Larry Miller and Don Egedy.
