continuing growth in both consumer use and expectations.
One reason for the high expectations is the high education level of people served by the library: 42 percent of residents in Farmington and Farmington Hills have not least one college degree, the said

"They have high expectations for the public schools and high use of the public

libraries," said Papsi. "Not just for their children, but for their own use."

Another factor is that Farmington Public Schools also places a high value on libraries, with each school building operating media centers staffed with professional librarians. Many of those students also go to the libraries to do homework projects.

'So we provide services to the same clientele, who pay the same taxes," Papai said.

The tax would enable the district and library to work together even more efficiently than they currently do, because of the installation of fiber optic links.

Sonlor citizons and pre-schoolers would also enjoy improved facilities.

For the older generation, there would

be a larger space for big print books as well as additional, more-comfortable room to browse and visit with friends who regularly come to the library, Papa said.

And more senior citizens are discovering computers.

The children's library would also benefit, with nower picture books replacing well-worn and even obsolete titles.

"It is vory used, it's used contantly," said Hills employee Essie Chynoweth, who works in the children's department. "Unfortunately, little hands are not like adult hands."
