EDITOR:

In the Sunday, Oct. 27 issue of the Farmington Enterprise and Observer, two letters from readers appeared, complimenting and expressing gratitude to our local police departments.

We are still pretty fortunate here in Farmington. We walk the streets at any time of the day or night with reasonable assurance that we are not going to become victims of a crime of violence. Our homes and places of business offer a feeling of security, with nothing more than occasional acts of minor vandalism to plague us.

Have you ever paused to consider what conditions might exist if we had no police department? Can you imagine the fear that would envelope us if we had no force stronger than individual personal ability to thwart felonies against our homes, property and persons?

This possibility is not as remote as it seems. How much longer do you feel police work is going to remain attractive to a young man smart enough to pass the mental tests for a police career, is going to be smart enough to seek employment in a field that is not downgraded and derided in so many cities across the land.

When the characters who adopt mono-sexual attire and adornment, and shun all vestiges of physical and mental cleanliness hurl epithets at officers such as "Pig" and embellish them with unprintable four-letter words, it is understandable, if not excusable.

However, when responsible citizens and news media line up with this trash, there is cause for concern. There have been entirely too many of them and I fault the Observer Newspapers for being in this category.

Columnists and comments on your editorial pages criticize the police for being "rough on these poor, innocent children." Your "Reporters on the scene" found the police reacting only to verbal insults and using unnecessary force with no real provocation.

I would like to ask one question in this connection - were these flower children obeying police orders and conducting themselves in an orderly and lawful manner, or were they laying down their own ground rules and doing just as they darn well pleased?

Receives Praise

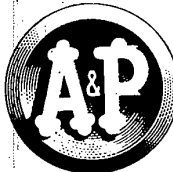
EDITOR:

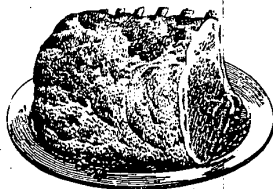

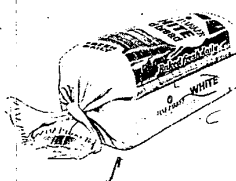

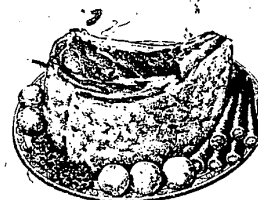
