

POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

The following are police and fire incidents that occurred in Farmington and Farmington Hills during the past week:

LARCENY

In Farmington Hills:
A telephone system valued at \$5,500 was reported stolen Aug. 17 from a storage room at Melchior Savings Bank, 33333 12 Mile Road. Police have no suspects.

INDECENT EXPOSURE

In Farmington:
A 26-year-old Farmington woman told police that she saw a man partially expose his genitals at Legends Video, in the 22000 block of Farmington Road.

She described the man as being in his 40s, wearing yellow bicycle shorts and a brown baseball cap.

According to reports, the suspect entered the store shortly after 11 a.m. Monday and walked around for a few minutes before going to the foyer entrance. The woman inadvertently turned and saw the man masturbating. He fled moments after the woman saw him.

MISSING PERSON

In Farmington Hills:
A patient of Common Ground Group Home, 27634 Westcott Crescent, was reported missing at about 10 a.m. Aug. 17. The patient was reportedly scheduled to be hospitalized Monday and had been acting violently toward other residents. He was diagnosed with a bipolar disorder and was taking medications. He was described as 6 feet tall, 250 pounds, with grayish-blond hair. He was wearing a red-checked shirt and blue jeans and was carrying two bags.

PAINTBALL ASSAULT

In Farmington:
A 17-year-old Farmington man said he was walking east on the north side of Grand River at Grace when someone leaned out of a passing vehicle and shot him with a paintball pellet. The incident took place at about 9 p.m. Tuesday.

The paintball left a quarter-sized welt on the victim's lower right back. He did not require medical treatment.

A similar incident apparently took place earlier that day in

Farmington Hills. Both incidents were being investigated to determine whether there was any connection.

The vehicle was described as a green Pontiac Grand Prix.

EQUIPMENT STOLEN

In Farmington Hills:
A backhoe valued at \$65,000 was reported stolen from a construction site Aug. 17 on Wintergreen Street near Halsted. Police have no suspects.

In Farmington Hills:

TEEN ASSAULTED

In Farmington Hills:
A 17-year-old male Livonia resident reported being assaulted by a pick-up truck driver about 4 p.m. Aug. 17 while

stopped on Middlebelt Road, south of 10 Mile. The driver told police he was going to turn but decided not to and went straight. A driver behind him reportedly became angry, got out of his car, approached the teen and hit him with both hands. The teen told police the other driver might have been angered when his passenger "tipped him off."

EMBEZZLEMENT

Twenty-one cartons of cigarettes valued at \$442 were reported missing Aug. 17 from Woodscene Amoco, 37410 Grand River.

About \$60 to \$70 of merchandise was reportedly taken without being paid for Aug. 18 at F & M, 31005 Orchard Lake Road. The cashier has been dismissed and the other employee has not been seen since Aug. 13.

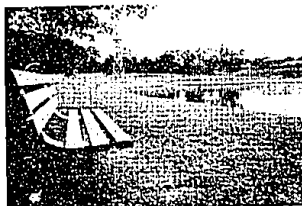
