During and after the meeting, Councilwoman JoAnne McShane emphasized that the city cannot tolerate business owners and landlords who do not fix such problems as they arise. Those who fail to do so are in violation of the city blight ordinance.

According to Lauhoff, the building inspector will check virtually every nook and cranny on the structures and surrounding property. Those include outside storage, weeds, sidewalks and driveways, fencing, upkeep (painting, etc.) and condition of buildings.

"Part of maintaining, and part of assuring that the community will stoy attractive is to assure all properties are maintained to high standards," said Lauhoff.

He stressed that the city is not picking on that part of Farmington. During the next two years, all areas will be so scrutinized.

Although Lauhoff is not serving up excuses for the guilty parties, he noted that newer businesses in town might not realize that doing a good one inside.

"They don't understand the exterior of the building is their advertisement to the community," Lauhoff said. "That says much more than any other advertising they do."

And then there are absentee landlords.

After the inspections are completed, probably during the fall, owners will be mailed forms with explanantions.of.those-necessary-repairs and deadlines for completing them, Lauhoff said.


