Chaudin Bass, daughter of Peggy and Chester Walker of Farmington, enlisted in the Air Force's Delayed Enlistment Program Aug. 4.


Bass, a 1998 graduate of Farmington High School, is scheduled for enlistment in the Regular Air Force on Dec. 9.
