Fire blamed on cans of combustibles

Farmington Hills fire officials urge residents to remove old cans of stain, paint, or varnish, which may also be combustible or flammable.

Case in point: A fire on the 35000 block of 13 Mile Sept. 2 that was caused after rusted cans of combustibles ignited from the heat produced by a water harter.

The homeowner told firefight-

ers that after returning home after working a double shift he smelled smoke throughout the house. Also, walls and furniture had a light soot on them.
When he went to his basement, the homeowner found 16 inches of water that gushed from a broken pipe.
Investigators surmise heat from the fire under the workbench caused the pipe to burst.

The gushing water, though, did put out the fire.


